

Redevelopment Update February 2011



As we hope for an early spring, planning for the move to the Our Lady of Mercy (OLM) Patient Care Wing is now underway at the Health Centre. We are joined by MHPM Project Leaders, who are meeting with the clinical programs that will be relocating to OLM. Health Centre staff and MHPM will be working closely over the coming months on occupancy planning and operational readiness to ensure a smooth transition of patients, staff and equipment to the new building.

From a construction perspective the majority of work currently revolves around completing the installation of drywall, suspended ceilings, ductwork, electrical systems, mechanical systems, and the elevators. Some of the detailed finishing work, like the tiling in the bathrooms and installation of t-bar ceilings, is underway on the lower floors and commencing on the upper floors. The installation of lighting fixtures has commenced and plumbing rough-in work is complete on the lower floors with installation of plumbing fixtures to commence shortly. Medical gas piping work is complete on the lower floors and underway on the upper floors and the installation of headwalls in the patient rooms is also underway, with both electrical and medical gas connections. Overall, the construction schedule indicates a late summer completion date after which the Health Centre can start preparing the building for move-in.
